
# BACDS AMERICAN WEEK 2010: Driving Directions to Camp

Camp registration opens on Saturday, July 3, 2010, at 4:00p.m. The cabins do not have electricity, so you should bring a flashlight and you may want to arrive early enough to unpack before it gets dark. Dinner will be served at 6:00 p.m. Dancing will begin at 7:30 p.m. An informative gathering along with staff introductions and brief class descriptions will be held at 9:00 p.m.



The week will close after breakfast on Saturday, July 10, 2010.

# DIRECTIONS: THE MENDOCINO WOODLANDS, CAMP #1

Approximate driving time from Sacramento, Oakland or San Francisco airports: 4 hours.

### From the Bay Area and Santa Rosa:

Take Highway 101 north to Cloverdale. Take Highway 128 west and stay on it until it merges with Highway 1 at the coast. Follow Highway 1 north to Mendocino.\*\*

### From Eureka area:

Take Highway 101 south to either Highway 1 (and go south) or Highway 20 (and go west). When you get to Fort Bragg, follow Highway 1 south to Mendocino.\*\*

## From Clearlake and Williams area:

Take Highway 20 west to Highway 101. Go north on 101 to Willits, then left (west) on Highway 20 until it dead ends at Highway 1. Turn left on Highway 1 south until you get to Mendocino.\*\*

### From Sacramento area:

Take I-5 north to Williams, go west on Highway 20 to Highway 101. Go north on 101 to Willits, then left (west) on Highway 20 until it dead ends at Highway 1. Turn left on Highway 1 going south until you get to Mendocino.\*\*

\*\* <u>Continued directions from above</u>: At the traffic light on highway 1 at Mendocino, turn east onto Little Lake Road and follow it out about 5-1/2 miles to the end of the pavement. Bear right (you'll see a sign for the Woodlands) and follow this gravel road out approximately another three miles to arrive at the camp, destination Camp #1. (There are three separate camps at the Woodlands - ours is Camp #1)
