

The Flaxley Green Dance

Traditional English



It was noted in 1857 or 1858, by J Buckley, from a wheelwright in Abbots Bromley, Staffordshire, called either Henry, or William, Robinson, who played it on the fiddle. Fiddler Robinson was famous at the time for being the only person who knew the proper tune for the Abbots Bromley Horn Dance. In the early 1900s, with an inexplicable disregard for traditional practice, Cecil Sharp published the tune to accompany a Sword Dance from the North of England.
