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# American Week 2019 and Beyond: It Takes a Village to create a Camp

BACDS American Week 2019 (or AmWeek) has come and gone, and has left us with lots of experiences and memories. There was an incredible staff including Wake Up Robin (Audrey Knuth, Andrew VanNorstrand, Amy Englesberg, Max Newman), The Figments (Anna Patton, Ethan Hazzard-Watkins, Owen Morrison), Susan Petrick, and Luke Donforth. They all did what they do so well, playing for and calling dances throughout the day and night, and playing for nightly mini-concerts. This year, all dances were called using gender-neutral role names of Larks and Ravens to encourage everyone to dance with everyone. The staff led small group sessions on music and/or dancing where campers were able to focus in on and experiment with aspects of the music or dance. Many of these sessions were unique opportunities and special moments. Each day there was Waltzing Before Breakfast organized by Elizabeth Todd, a wonderful variety of camper-led pop-up short sessions (under the title of Potpourri), crafts led by Bowen Lee, gentle yoga led by Cheryl McKinney, and after 10 pm acoustic music for dancing or jams, singing, and game playing.



There were many opportunities for campers to try out different things or hone their craft, and from which they took away their own experiences and helped create music and dances that can be shared with the general contra dance community. Susan led a Callers' Workshop, Amy and Audrey led the Camper Band, and these came together for the camper-led Wednesday night dance which is always wonderful and creative. Luke led a choreography session that created two dances, both of which were called during camp and/or the AmWeek Friday Night Gala that was open to the public. During the auction (which helps with scholarships), one camper commissioned a dance by Luke, and another commissioned a tune by the merged efforts of members of Wake Up Robin and The Figments.

As the 38th BACDS American Week Dance and Music Camp, this week followed a long tradition of wonderful and often unique experiences. However, there were only 56 campers, and while most felt a strong camaraderie within the small group, enrollment was far below the number to make the camp financially viable. It was a significant drop in attendance, and the lowest in a slightly decreasing trend since 2014. Numerous campers who have attended AmWeek quite regularly had other commitments or places that they chose to be this year, but it seems likely that was not the only contributing factor to such a large decrease. True, many dance weekends and camps across the country are struggling (or at least are challenged) and not filling. We tried offering partial-week attendance, a sliding scale fee, and gender-neutral calling, but these changes did not result in sufficient attendance.



Because the current camp model cannot be expected to avoid another year of financial losses, the BACDS Board has decided to put AmWeek on hiatus for the time being, and we are not currently programming for 2020. This does not mean AmWeek is over; however, it needs an infusion of enthusiasm and energy to consider how it might be revitalized, or what sort of event might be created to take its place. We need reconsideration, redefinition, and reimagination for all the who, what, when, and where aspects of the camp. If you are keen to share insights and ideas, we invite you to join a conversation this fall to envision what might come next. You don't need to commit to organizing the next incarnation--though you could! If you know that the lack of AmWeek will leave a ragged hole in your summer, funnel some energy into revitalizing our lovely camp.
